

More than 30 years in the making, Aurora Expeditions has a track record for pioneering discovery and adventure – and respectful travel is at the heart of our ethos.

And while we have two new ships, both certified 100% Carbon Neutral, our spirit of discovery and adventure remains as strong as ever, as we continue to keep exploring the most awe-inspiring destinations on our planet. We have an informal style and experiential approach to expedition travel, which is delivered by our exceptional expedition leaders and their skilled teams.



Our Ships

Designed for discovery

Our two expedition ships are both new to the fleet and are designed for discovery. These ultra-modern purpose-built ships use the latest advances in design and technology, truly revolutionising the small-ship experience.

Our ships, the *Greg Mortimer* and the *Sylvia Earle*, are a base camp for adventure and are capable of exploring the farthest reaches of the planet. The Ulstein X-BOW® hull makes sailing smoother and faster, is designed to leave the marine environment undisturbed and allows for incomparable up-close encounters with nature.

The *Greg Mortimer* honours Aurora Expeditions' founder explorer, mountaineer and all-round dynamo Greg Mortimer OAM. The *Sylvia Earle* is named after leading conservationist, marine biologist, oceanographer and explorer, Dr Sylvia Earle. In 1998, Sylvia Earle was the first person selected as 'Hero for the Planet' by *Time* magazine and is dedicated to protecting the world's oceans.

Every stateroom features an ocean view and nearly all include balconies. Our staterooms and suites range in size and spaciousness to suit a variety of priorities. And while making enriching discoveries and new friends, each ship has everything you need to maximise relaxation and comfort (including heated floors in the bathrooms on polar voyages).

The gym, wellness centre, sauna, cosy library, restaurants, bar and presentation theatre all feature floor-to-ceiling windows. There are outside decks, and also observation wings that extend outwards either side of the ship when something exciting is happening.



Greg Mortimer

Explorer Greg Mortimer is a true icon of the field – a veteran of almost three decades of Antarctic research, mountaineering and polar travel.

We are privileged to be able to pay tribute to his extraordinary achievements and have named our new, custom-built expedition ship the *Greg Mortimer* to honour his legacy – embodying his incredible spirit of adventure and exploration.

On 3 October 1984, Greg and his expedition partner Tim Macartney-Snape became the first two Australians to reach the summit of Mount Everest, and even more impressively – they did so without the aid of supplementary oxygen. From there, Greg went on to climb K2 and Chongtar – again, without supplementary oxygen.

Since scaling some of the world's highest mountains, Greg has been awarded an Order of Australia (OAM) for his services to mountaineering and has received three Australian Geographic Society Medals.

After working together on the Australian Bicentennial Antarctic Expedition in 1988, Greg Mortimer co-founded Aurora Expeditions with his wife Margaret, with the aim of sharing his incredible experiences with like-minded wanderers of the world.

Greg and Margaret's aim was simple – to take small groups of travellers on voyages of discovery to regions that inspired them, thereby creating lifelong ambassadors for the preservation and protection of these sacred places.

Now, 30 years on, Aurora Expeditions still leads smaller groups to remote and breathtaking destinations all over the world, and has grown to offer passengers a wide range of action-packed activities such as polar snorkelling, sea kayaking and alpine crossing, all inspired by Greg Mortimer's great sense of adventure.

Dr Sylvia Earle

Once in a blue moon, not to mention a deep blue ocean, we are blessed with a partnership that fills us with an extraordinary sense of excitement, anticipation and hope for the future of the planet. That time is now.

We are honoured, humbled and delighted to welcome and introduce the incomparable Dr Sylvia Earle as the newest member of the Aurora Expeditions family. Launching in 2022, our brand new, purpose-built expedition ship *Sylvia Earle* is named in her honour and pays tribute to her lifelong contributions to ocean conservation. We will be unveiling other exciting conservation and environmental programs in partnership with Dr Earle in the future.

Renowned oceanographer, marine biologist and explorer, Dr Earle was the first female Chief Scientist of the US National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. A National Geographic Society Explorer-in-Residence since 1998, she was named by *Time* magazine as its first 'Hero for the Planet' that same year.

Her key conservation initiative Mission Blue is creating a global network of marine protected areas, known as 'Hope Spots'. These richly biodiverse marine environments – which our ships will visit on various voyages – are critical to the health of our oceans, which in turn helps to safeguard the future wellbeing of the planet.

Now a valued partner of Aurora Expeditions, Dr Earle aims to educate and inspire people to become ambassadors for the vast but vulnerable marine world. 'Our goal is literally to inspire a network of hope – one place, one community, one vision at a time – but together around the world,' she says.



We invite you to join Aurora Expeditions, Dr Earle, our Expedition Teams and entire crew in perspective-altering voyages to some of the most remote, unique and spectacular places on the planet, from the Arctic to Antarctica and an array of fascinating destinations in between.

The Differences Between the Arctic and Antarctic Regions

What animals can you expect to see?

While both polar regions are full of snow and ice, the animals that live there are unique. Antarctica is famous for its penguins, with eight species living on the continent and surrounding subantarctic islands. The Arctic is where you travel to find polar bears with their thick white coats and a layer of fat keeping them warm and camouflaged in the Arctic environment.

The word Arctic comes from the Greek word *arktikós*, 'near the bear, northern'. The Great Bear constellation can be seen in the northern sky.

Arctic

There are eight countries within the Arctic region: Norway, Sweden, Finland, Russia, the United States (Alaska), Canada, Denmark (Greenland) and Iceland.

The name Antarctica comes from the Greek words *antí arktikós*, meaning 'opposite to the Arctic' or opposite to the north.



Do People Live There?

Antarctica

Antarctica has no permanent human population. There are over 60 research stations, where staff reside seasonally or annually.

Arctic

Yes. Humans have lived in the Arctic for thousands of years. Today, there are more than two million people living north of 60°N, many in modern settlements.



Which is Larger in Size?

The Arctic and Antarctica have many things in common: one is their size. The polar regions cover the ends of the earth like caps, and the Arctic is just slightly larger than Antarctica.

However, the largest ice sheets vary greatly in size.

Antarctica 14 million km² (5.4 million square miles)

Arctic 1.71 million km² (0.66 million square miles)



Antarctica is governed collectively by

54 nations under the Antarctic Treaty.

Best Time to Visit

Fortunately, we steer clear of the polar regions in winter. When we visit in summer, the weather is actually quite pleasant! Temperatures across the regions vary greatly. In summer, the average temperature at the North Pole is barely freezing at 0°C (-32°F), while the South Pole remains much colder at -28°C (-18°F).




Deep Weddell following Nordenskjöld Antarctic Peninsula, Weddell Sea | 14 Days

A new voyage that focuses on the Weddell Sea region more than any of our other voyages. The Weddell Sea is renowned for vast amounts of ice – sea ice, pack ice and gigantic icebergs. Even icebreakers have difficulty getting around in the Weddell Sea. For adventurous expeditioners, a visit to the area can be rewarding, not least for its historical associations. In 1902, Swedish explorer Otto Nordenskjöld was forced to spend two winters on the Weddell Sea, and the main expedition hut built on Snow Hill Island still stands. The area is also central to Ernest Shackleton's well-known expedition when the *Endurance* became trapped in the ice. In addition to ice-watching opportunities, the area is also rich in wildlife, geology and palaeontology. We hope to see ice seals such as crabeater and leopard seals. On the shores, you can scour for ancient fossils of gastropods, large clams and spiral-shaped ammonites.

DAYS 5–11 A voyage to the Antarctic Peninsula is by its very nature a genuine adventure, but to venture to the Weddell Sea region, located on the wild eastern side of the peninsula, is turning up the dial a few notches. The Weddell Gyre pushes enormous amounts of ice from the Filchner-Ronne Ice Shelf up towards the area near the Antarctic Sound, blocking the entrance to the Weddell Sea. While a considerable aspect of a voyage to the Weddell Sea is the thrill of not knowing if the ice will allow us to enter its frozen realm, a visit to the region still has numerous rewards.

Gigantic icebergs, the size of skyscrapers, dwarf our Zodiacs as we attempt to push through seemingly impenetrable sea ice to land on remote beaches where ancient fossils can be found. The wildlife we may encounter in the Weddell Sea region makes the attempt worthwhile. The abundant ice attracts ice seals, such as crabeater, leopard and Weddell seals, which all breed and birth on sea ice. Large numbers of orca, minke and humpback whales are also commonly seen here.



It is an icy realm that few have been fortunate to experience.

As we return north, we make our way to the Weddell Sea, where we plan to visit some of our favourite places around the Antarctic Peninsula. We explore coastlines by Zodiac, landing on beaches where fur seals frolic and fledging penguins take to the waters for the first time. As we approach Antarctic Sound, gateway to the Weddell Sea, we hope for favourable weather and ice conditions to grant our good ship entry to its frozen realm.






Falkland Islands and Antarctic Peninsula Falklands~Malvinas, Antarctic Peninsula | 16 Days

A wildlife hotspot and paradise for birders, the Falkland~Malvinas is often a stop on a longer itinerary to the Antarctic. We enjoy an in-depth, five-day exploration of the Falkland Islands~Islas Malvinas. In the islands' capital, Stanley, we delve into the history of the islands. Black-browed albatross, Magellanic and gentoo penguins are laying eggs, and elephant seals are giving birth and suckling pups.

Experience the Antarctic Peninsula in mid-spring when it is at its most pristine and ideal for landscape photography. Zodiac-cruise through a maze of sea ice, tread on freshly fallen snow and witness penguins as they court, mate and sit on their nests.

There are 63 breeding species and 23 annual migrants. The black-browed albatross breeds here in large colonies and another six species have been seen offshore. If seeing penguins is high on your wish list, there are no less than six species of breeding penguins found in the Falklands~Malvinas that we hope to see. The landscape offers mountain ranges, rolling moorlands, flat plains, rugged coastlines battered and shaped by the wild Atlantic Ocean, sandy beaches and flat-faced cliffs. A tall, native tussock grass that is mostly found near the coast provides an important habitat for many birds and shelter for some seals. In this remote wilderness, nature determines what we are able to do and see. Your Expedition Team will draw on their deep experience to curate your day-to-day 'itinerary' and share their knowledge of the wildlife, natural environment and rich history of

the region with tales of early exploration and exploits.

DAYS 8–13 Join a privileged group of adventurers to visit Antarctica, a true final frontier. Explore the Antarctic Peninsula and be dazzled by the icy landscapes of glaciers, icebergs and towering mountains. Witness unique wildlife that thrive nowhere else but in this stark, desolate and unimaginably beautiful environment. Penguins court and mate, and ice seals breed on ice, as our Zodiacs gently forge a path through sea ice to take you ashore for walks along beaches where the wildlife is equally curious about you as you are about them. Make sure your cameras are fully charged, they will be snapping nonstop. DAYS 14–15 Drake Passage crossing.


Northern Lights Explorer

Staying close to the Arctic Circle, we skirt the Norwegian Sea and Greenland Sea, exploring remote islands and villages of the region. As night falls, we look skywards hoping to catch the magic of the northern lights. This spectacular natural phenomenon offers a dazzling light show of blue, green, pink and violet dancing across the night sky. Places located near the Arctic Circle, such as northern Norway, Iceland and Greenland, offer superb opportunities to witness this natural phenomenon.

- Sail in the prime region to encounter the dazzling aurora borealis
- Discover Vega Island, an important centre for the production of eider duck down and a UNESCO World Heritage Site
- Discover the world's largest fjord system in the world at Scoresbysund, a superb place to photograph icebergs
- Iceland's remote Westfjords offers hikes among splendid scenery where you will rarely see another soul

DAY 1 Arrive in Kirkenes and transfer to your hotel. DAY 2 Embark in Kirkenes.

DAY 3 Enjoy an afternoon hike at Skarsvåg village and witness spectacular views of North Cape in good weather.

DAY 4 After a day at sea, enjoy an afternoon of cruising the wonderfully narrow and impressive Trollfjord.

DAY 5 The Lofoten Islands offer some of Norway's most stunning scenery, including jagged mountain peaks, deep fjords, colourful fishing villages and wildlife-rich waterways.

DAY 6 Explore UNESCO World Heritage-listed Vega Island and learn about its famous duck-down industry. Later, we stretch our legs on a hike at Mount Torghatten, famous for the hole through its centre.

DAYS 10–13 In East Greenland we plan to visit Kaiser Franz Joseph and Kong Oscar fjord and aim to reach Scoresbysund, the world's largest fjord system and birthplace of hundreds of spectacular Greenland icebergs. We hope to visit the remote Inuit community of Ittoqqortoormiit. Wildlife sightings may include musk oxen, arctic hares, seals, little auk, puffin, fulmar and ravens.

DAY 14 At sea. Savour every opportunity to glimpse the northern lights whenever you encounter a clear, dark sky.

DAYS 15–17 Iceland's remote Westfjords attract nature lovers to its secluded bays and fjords to walk among its sublime scenery. Explore traditional fishing villages and meet friendly locals and seek out wildlife on Zodiac cruises along deep fjords and hidden bays, where you would be lucky if you came across another soul. DAY 18 At sea.

DAYS 19–20 The jaw-droppingly spectacular scenery of the Faroe Islands is sure to impress. Witness waterfalls tumbling from clifftops into the sea, see and hear thousands of raucous seabirds breeding in towering cliffs and visit traditional villages with grass roofs.

DAY 22 Disembark in Bergen.




Iceland, Jan Mayen, Svalbard Iceland, Jan Mayen, Svalbard | 15 Days

From the volcanic landscapes of Iceland and Jan Mayen, following the ice edge to the Arctic wonderland of Svalbard, you will delight in the breathtaking contrasts as you sail across the Arctic Circle to the High Arctic, attempting to reach 80° north latitude. Keep a close watch for tail flukes as whales prepare to dive, or a pronounced blow as they surface for breath. Our binoculars are constantly focused on the pack ice, looking for the majestic polar bears, as thrilling Zodiac excursions reveal glacier-filled fjords and walruses hauled out on ice floes.

- In Iceland, experience one of the planet's youngest countries and marvel at its spectacular volcanic landscape
- Cross the Arctic Circle from Iceland to Jan Mayen as we head to magical Svalbard situated in the High Arctic
- Be one of few people to attempt to land on remote Jan Mayen, home to Mount Beerenberg, the northernmost active volcano in the world
- Explore Svalbard, where dazzling scenery, mesmerising wildlife and adventure awaits





DAY 1 Arrive in Reykjavik and transfer our group hotel. DAY 2 Embarkation day.

DAYS 3–5 Discover the staggeringly beautiful Westfjords region of Iceland, home to Látrabjarg Cliffs, the westernmost point in Europe and one of the best places to photograph puffins in Iceland. Visit the quaint, tiny town of Ísafjörður, the largest in Westfjords and an important trading post since the 16th century. At Hornstrandir Nature Reserve, an uninhabited region, the only inhabitants are arctic foxes, and birds that envelope the tall cliffs. DAY 6 Sail to Jan Mayen accompanied by seabirds while keeping a close watch for whales that frequent these waters, or perhaps browse our well-stocked library for a book on the region that we are visiting.

DAY 7 The approach to Jan Mayen is spectacular. We will attempt a landing to enjoy a hike on this remote, mist-shrouded and rarely visited volcanic island – the northernmost island on the mid-Atlantic rift. The northern part of the island is a great place to look for whales and dolphins and contains impressive glaciers, some of which reach the sea.

DAYS 8–9 Sail towards Svalbard, searching for the ice edge as we continue north. It is breeding season for harp seals and we hope to see them breeding on the sea ice.

DAYS 10–14 Enjoy a world of near-endless daylight, where the possibility of spotting polar bears quickens your pulse, guillemot cries echo from sea cliffs and beluga whales beguile those lucky enough to spot them. Hike across tundra adorned with colourful wildflowers, visit historic camps of explorers and hunters and push through pack ice to find walrus and bearded seals. DAY 15 Disembark in Longyearbyen.

Complete Northwest Passage West Greenland, Canada, USA | 30 Days

On this epic voyage inspired by Roald Amundsen's historic expedition, we attempt to sail the full length of the Northwest Passage, carving our way west through the labyrinthine maze of waterways that hug the fabled islands of Arctic Canada, until we reach the Beaufort Sea. Building on our classic Northwest Passage voyage, we visit historical sites explored by heroic adventurers, meet the incredible folk that call this region home, and search for enigmatic wildlife found in this unique corner of the world.

- The sheer thrill and adventure of attempting a full transit of the Northwest from West Greenland to Nome
- Search for iconic arctic wildlife including musk oxen, polar bears, beluga whales, walrus and perhaps narwhal
- Adventure awaits on a genuine expedition where nature determines where you go and what you see
- The sun barely sets as we sail above the Arctic Circle





DAY 1 Arrive in Toronto for overnight stay.

DAY 2 Fly to Greenland and embark in Kangerlussuaq.

DAY 3 Just above the Arctic Circle, Sisimiut offers a fascinating museum and quaint and colourful 18th-century timber buildings. DAY 4 Visit UNESCO Heritage-listed Icefjord at Ilulissat and perhaps enjoy an optional scenic helicopter flight over the ice cap. DAY 5 On a guided hike at Qeqertarsuaq, Disko Island, we hope to see some spectacular icebergs gleaming in the bay.

DAY 6 Cross the Davis Strait to Qikiqtarjuaq, Baffin Island, where we enter Canada.

DAY 7 Isabella Bay is an important feeding ground for a large population of bowhead whales.

DAY 8 Soak in the stunning fjord scenery of Sillem Island, where we attempt a circumnavigation, time and conditions permitting. DAY 9 Meet the Inuit locals in picturesque Pond Inlet, surrounded by scenic mountains and glaciers descending from small ice caps. DAY 10 Sailing Navy Board Inlet offers exceptional views of Bylot and Devon islands. Keep a close watch for the unique wildlife that visit this area, including beluga whales and the elusive narwhal.

DAY 11 Enjoy a hike at Dundas Harbour to a former Royal Mounted Police outpost. At Croker Bay, we plan to launch our Zodiacs for an excursion along the face of an active glacier.

DAY 12 An important stop on the voyage, Beechey Island is the final resting place of three members of Franklin's unlucky expedition to find the Northwest Passage. Visit an impressive Thule archaeological site at Radstock Bay and marvel at Caswell Tower, an isolated limestone mountain.

DAYS 13–17 Our options for the following days are heavily dependent on unpredictable sea ice. We may attempt to cross Bellot Strait if conditions allow, giving us the possibility to sail Prince Regent Sound and search for wildlife and perhaps visit historic Fort Ross, an abandoned Hudson's Bay trading post. Other memorable places that we may visit includes Prince Leopold Island, which features magnifent vertical bird cliffs. At Cunningham Inlet, with some luck, we may see the unforgettable site of hundreds of beluga whales which have especially travelled to this very spot, shedding their skin on shallow sandy banks. Around the low-lying Tasmanian Islands, we may encounter similar pack ice that halted Franklin's expedition in 1846. If conditions allow, we might enjoy a walk at historic Cape Felix on King William Island and learn more about Franklin's ill-fated expedition.

DAY 18 Stretch your legs on a town tour of Cambridge Bay, where you can support local artisans by purchasing local handicrafts. DAY 19 Enjoy a Zodiac excursion within an estuary at Johansen Bay on Victoria Island and delight in autumn colours on Edinburgh Island where wild blueberries grow.

DAY 20 At sea.

DAY 21 By Zodiac and on a hike, explore the dramatic landscapes of hills, valleys, cliffs and canyons on Banks Island.

DAY 22 Marvel at the geological wonder evocatively known as the 'Smoking Hills,' in Franklin Bay.

DAY 23 Excitement builds as we near Beaufort Sea, heralding a triumphant, complete crossing of the fabled Northwest Passage. DAY 24 Near the border with Alaska, Herschel Island, an abandoned island located five kilometres off the north coast of the Yukon, signals that our time in Canada is almost over. DAY 25 Point Barrow is the northernmost settlement in America

DAYS 26–28 If we have made it this far, it is time to celebrate a successful full transit of the Northwest Passage. Frozen for most of the year, the Beaufort Sea may still present some challenges, but it is time to raise a toast to an unforgettable and truly epic voyage. DAY 29 Disembark in Nome and fly to Anchorage for an overnight stay.

DAY 30 Depart Anchorage.

DAY 17 Depart Calgary.









The *Sylvia Earle* Deck Plan






