The Vessel

Duen III is a 72 ft (22 m) ketch rigged sailing vessel built in 1987. It was designed by Robert Perry, a renowned American boat designer.

The vessel has a comfortable pilot house, a big saloon, six cabins, a crows nest, and an 8-person hot tub on the aft.

She has circumnavigated the world twice before she ended up in Northern Norway with the purpose of taking people on Arctic adventure voyages.


The vessel is well equipped for Arctic sailing, with radiators in all cabins as well as an indoor steering position. Three different seating areas allow for plenty of personal space on board.

Cabins

Duen III has two double cabins in the aft, two twin cabins in the front, one crew cabin, and one small twin cabin in the bow to accommodate our guests or guides. Each cabin has an ensuite bathroom with toilet and shower. Linen and towels are included.

Facilities

Water maker, heating system with radiators in all cabins, wooden crates on deck to store dive gear and other equipment, drying cabinet, fishing rods/equipment, and a wood fired hot tub to enjoy after a full day of activities.









There are two identical double cabins (which can be also booked as single cabin) in the aft and two identical twin cabins.

Also there is one crew cabin, and a small twin cabin in the bow to accommodate our guests or guides.

Each cabin has an ensuite bathroom with toilet and shower.

Linen and towels are included onboard.
